The Vision for Data Exchange in California





The Data Exchange Framework (DxF) creates new connections and efficiencies between health and social services providers, improving whole-person care.

The DxF is California's first-ever statewide Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) that requires the secure and appropriate exchange of health and human services information to enable providers to work together and improve an individual's health and wellbeing.

What We Heard on May 7, 2024

- Last meeting had a high level of engagement. Thank you!
- Several TASC members reported challenges with the size and content of rosters.
- Varying levels of participation by facilities and subscribers.
- Interest in seeing how FHIR could be employed more broadly.
- More centralized models seem to offer better opportunity for success.
- Interest in greater standardization (e.g., data quality, minimum data elements).
- Need to consider the affordability of notification services for the sender and receiver of ADT messages.
- Notifications must be received in “real-time”.
- How is patient consent addressed?
