# The Vision for Data Exchange in California

The Data Exchange Framework (DxF) creates new connections and efficiencies between health and social services providers, improving whole-person care.

The DxF is California's first-ever statewide Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) that requires the secure and appropriate exchange of health and human services information to enable providers to work together and improve an individual's health and wellbeing.

# TASC Series 4 Objective

The TASC Series 4 meetings will center on discussing the potential of advancing FHIR within the DxF.

# What We Heard on November 8, 2024

Several TASC members presented the current FHIR landscape in the industry sector they represent. Key takeaways include:

- **Electronic Health Records (EHRs):** FHIR R4 is widely adopted in EHR systems, with providers and patient-facing apps as primary users. Several challenges persist, including a diverse set of implementation standards and low adoption of bulk FHIR exchange.
- **Health Plans:** Plans have been gradually moving towards FHIR adoption, motivated by regulatory requirements with a 2027 deadline. While consumer data requests are minimal, health plans anticipate high FHIR use for quality reporting (e.g., HEDIS) and prior authorization.
- **Health Information Organizations (HIOs):** HIOs report few current FHIR use cases. HIOs are preparing to integrate FHIR, with a focus on patient data alerts and event notifications.

# What We Heard on November 8, 2024

Several TASC members presented the current FHIR landscape in the industry sector they represent. Key takeaways include:

- **Social Services:** Some states, such as New York, have demonstrated significant value in FHIR for social care data exchange. The Statewide Health Information Network for New York (SHIN-NY) is now testing FHIR-based exchange between health and social service providers in support of its 1115 Waiver demonstration.
- **Federal Programs/TEFCA:** The Federal FHIR Action Plan identifies core capabilities for adoption across healthcare, quality reporting, public health, and research, aiming to standardize FHIR integration nationally. The TEFCA FHIR roadmap is advancing FHIR exchange among QHINs, primarily to establish security and endpoint discovery.
